On Day one, Bishop Bickerton asked the delegates: Are you willing to move forward in a spirit of hope, and embrace a season of reformation, commit to the revitalization of The United Methodist Church, and work for a culture marked by compassion, courage, and companionship?" If not, maybe you are in the wrong place! A new creation comes to life and grows, As Christ's new body takes on flesh and blood. Alleluia! On Day two, Bishop Holston reminded the delegates to embrace the radical, world-transforming love given so freely by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. "When the world shouts hate; help us to love.
